this Privacy Policy provides you with information regarding the processing of your personal data carried in order to allow you to donate in accordance with Regulation (EU) no. 2016/679 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data (hereinafter "GDPR"). This Privacy Policy describes the personal data we collect, how it is used and shared, and your choices regarding this data. 1. Contacting Us

The Data Controller is Fondazione Nursia Via Case Sparse n. 164, CAP 06046 Norcia (PG), Italy (hereinafter "Foundation"). Please note that when you contact us to assist you, for your safety and ours we may need to authenticate your identity before fulfilling your request.

2. Data Source

- *Information you provide to us:* information such as name, surname, e-mail address, mailing address, or any other information given freely by you to the Foundation.

- *Information collected from third parties:* we collect information from other companies that provide services to you while navigating our website such as payment service providers. In order to discover how they process your personal data you can access their privacy policy published on their website.

3. Purposes and legal basis

a) Donation

Name, surname, billing address, email address, amount donated. If you choose to donate via PayPal your payments will be processed this supplier. In order to discover how PayPal process your personal data you can access their privacy policy published on their website. When processing your payment requests, PayPal may share with the Foundation the above mentioned data and the transaction code.	In order to allow you to make a donation.	Processing is carried out in the course of its legitimate activities with appropriate safeguards by a foundation, association or any other not-for-profit body with a political, philosophical, religious or trade union aim and on condition that the processing relates solely to the members or to former members of the body or to persons who have regular contact with it in connection with its purposes and that the personal data are not disclosed outside that body without the consent of the data subjects (Article 9 (2) (d) GDPR).

Your personal data is necessary and mandatory for the aforementioned purpose. Any refusal to provide them would prevent us from providing the requested services.

b) Protection in court

The information provided and acquired	Defending our rights in case of disputes.	The processing is carried out on the basis of the legitimate interest of the data controller (Article 6 (1)(f) GDPR).

Your personal data is necessary and mandatory for the aforementioned purpose. Any refusal to provide them would prevent us from providing the requested services.

4. Data Storage and Protection

Personal data will be processed by both automated and non-automated means. We use providers that are located outside the EU, this means that your data might be stored and transferred outside the EU. In these cases, we will transfer your personal data on the basis of an adequacy decision adopted by the European Commission or by implementing appropriate safeguards to ensure adequate protection of your personal data in the place of destination pursuant to articles 44 ff. of the GDPR.

Your personal data will be kept as long as necessary to fulfill the purposes indicated above, without prejudice to the cases in which the retention for a longer period is necessary to comply with the applicable legislation or with requests received by competent authorities. The personal data that we process on the basis of your consent are retained until your consent is withdrawn.

5. Sharing Your Personal Data

Data will be accessed only by subjects authorized and trained by the Foundation.

We may share your data with our contractors, service providers, consultants and commercial partners as well as with any competent judicial, administrative or regulatory authority upon their requests or in compliance with any legal obligations to which the Monastery is subject.

6. Data protection Rights

You can request access to your personal information, or correct or update out-of-date or inaccurate personal information we hold about you. You may also request that we delete personal information that we hold about you.

You can object to processing of your personal information, ask us to restrict the processing of your personal information or request portability of your personal information; if we have collected and processed your personal information with your consent, then you can withdraw your consent at any time; withdrawing your consent will not affect the lawfulness of any processing we conducted prior to your withdrawal, nor will it affect processing of your personal information conducted in reliance on lawful processing grounds other than consent.

You also have the right to lodge a complaint with a Data Protection Authority about our collection and use of your personal information, in particular in the Member State in which you habitually live or work or in the place where the alleged violation took place.
